1. Core Content: Equality & Empowerment

This lesson examines women's rights as an essential catalyst for global development and poverty reduction:

A. Key Concepts from UNIFEM Speech

- **The Core Message:** Women's rights and empowerment are key to achieving global development goals [cite: 1].
- **Fundamental Rights:** Men and women have the right to live their lives and raise children in dignity, free from hunger, violence, and oppression [cite: 1].

3. Grammar Focus: Quantifiers

Using correct quantities for countable and uncountable nouns:

- **A little + uncountable noun:** Represents some or a small amount [cite: 1].
- **A few + countable noun(s):** Represents some or a small number [cite: 1].
- **A lot of + countable/uncountable nouns:** Represents more than enough or plenty of [cite: 1].
